FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK: "THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM"

Do you know the date of your Baptism? It was the most important day of your life. Our Baptism puts us in touch with Jesus, the Word made Flesh, the incarnate expression of God's love. The Father so loved the world that He gave us His Son that we might have life through Him. Jesus became human and He is our God. Jesus is, precisely as human, the way, the truth and the life. Jesus is my way to live and find God. Jesus is the truth of who I am, and who I am called to become. Jesus is my very life. He shows me how to live as a son/daughter of God. To be a Catholic is to seek to become fully human. As St. Irenaeus said in the early church "the glory of God is the human person fully alive." It is Jesus as human, who helps us become more human and therein we discover the mystery of our calling to share divine life. In becoming human Jesus is God-with-us. As son of Mary He reveals outwardly the inward mystery - He is also Son of God. His humanness is the outward sign of inward grace, His divinity. The nature of a sacrament is that it is an outward sign of inward grace. The very life of the church, the mystical body of Christ, shares in His sacramental mystery. The church is the outward sign of Jesus dwelling in our hearts and minds, enlivening us and drawing us into ever greater unity as the people of God.
