### **ONE HEART, ONE SOUL CAPITAL CAMPAIGN**

Campaign preparations are on-going and the active campaign will take place in four % aves+beginning with a pilot wave that will begin in February 2019. The campaign will conclude when the last wave finishes in early 2021. With 120 parishes in the Diocese, it will be more effective to break up the campaign into smaller pieces over time, to give each Parish as much support and direction as possible from the Diocese and the Parishesq consultant, the Steier Group. It also provides options as parishes are assigned to waves. For some Parishes, conducting the campaign in an early wave will allow them to get started on needed projects. Other Parishes will need more time to weigh what projects need to be a priority and to prepare for the campaign.
