Learn to Pray the Divine Office

Since the earliest days the Church has prayed the Divine Office (Liturgy of the Hours) as a way to fulfill the Lord's command to "pray without ceasing". The various "Hours" of the Office punctuate the day with prayer, mostly drawn from the Psalms, the prayer book of Jesus. Over the centuries the Liturgy of the Hours became a prayer almost exclusively reserved to clergy and religious. However, the Second Vatican Council desired that the Divine Office once again become the "Prayer of the Church". Accordingly, I am pleased to offer a series of workshops for people interested in learning to pray the Divine Office. Sessions will be held on the following Wednesdays, November 3, 10 and 17. Please register with Susan in the office 519-824-3951. Each session builds upon the previous one, so all sessions are necessary. Breviaries will be available, but it is recommended that you purchase your own at a charge of \$60.00. Praying the Liturgy of the Hours will become a regular part of our worship here at the Basilica.
